Age of Enlightenment	Cultural movement that focused on reason, logic, and scientific thought.
Sturm und Drang	"Storm and Stress." A literary movement that was meant to overthrow Enlightenment Rationalism.
Weimar Classicism	Literary and cultural movement uniting ideas from Romanticis <mark>m, Clas</mark> sicism, and the Age of Enlightenment.
Romanticism	Cultural movement that focuses on emotion, individualism, and the glorification of nature and the past.

Friedrich Schiller 1759-1805

Poet, Playwright, philosopher, historian. Explored themes of freedom, justice, and human dignity. Wrote contributions to the German Romanticism and Weimar Classicism.

Johann Von Goethe 1749-1832

Writer, poet, statesman, playwright. He studied philosophy and science in addition to writing poetry and drama. Key figure in Sturm und Drang and Weimar Classicism.
